

Hotel Gaillard



The Cité de l'économie et de la monnaie is hosted in the Hotel Gaillard. This neo-gothic mansion was built between 1878 and 1882 by the architect Jules Février at the request of Emile Gaillard, a banker from the city of Grenoble, who was an amateur and collector of Middle Ages and Renaissance art. The Hotel Gaillard was sold to the Banque de France in 1919. From 1919 to 1921, architectural works were carried out by architect Alphonse Defrasse for the Banque de France, including the Grand Lobby, a steel structure which housed the cashiers' desks and other services for the visitors. He also imagined the impressive strong room which could only be accessed by an electric draw-bridge, over a two-metre-deep moat. Listed as an historic monument in 1999, this branch was closed in 2006, as a consequence of the plan to close half the branches of the Banque de France in France .
